

#### Admission Fees

- An application fee of \$50, payable at the time of application submission
- Fees for the Independent School Entrance Examination (ISEE), required of Middle School applicants (Fifth through Eighth Grade), may vary depending on method of registration and schedule. ## The Admissions Process: A Step-by-Step Guide

- 1. Contact the Admissions Office to request an admissions packet and schedule a campus tour.
- 2. Complete and submit the following:
  - Forms (Found online at St.AnnesSchool.org and may be filled out electronically or by hand.)
    - St. Anne's School Application for Admission
    - Transcripts from current school (Please submit Transcript Release Form to your child's school)
    - Confidential teacher recommendations (Please submit confidential **Teacher Recommendation Forms** to your child's school) \*Students applying for Fifth through Eighth Grade are required to submit recommendations from both math and language arts teachers, if applicable.
  - Submit the \$50 application fee.
  - If applying for financial aid, your **Financial Aid Application** should be submitted at the same time that you apply for admission. Please refer to our website, **St.AnnesSchool.org**, for further information.
- 3. Schedule a Shadow Day for First through Eighth Grade candidates.

Give your child the chance to experience the classroom setting and get to know our students and teachers. Our Shadow Day is an excellent way for your child to explore life at St. Anne's School. Shadow Days are scheduled through our Admissions Office.

#### 4. Schedule screening and testing.

The Admissions Office will contact you once it receives your application to schedule dates for your child's screening and testing. You will find the current testing dates listed in the Admissions Calendar.

- Preschool, Prekindergarten and Kindergarten candidates are administered a readiness screening in a small group setting on the St. Anne's School campus. See enclosed Admissions Calendar for our screening date.
- First through Fourth Grade candidates are administered academic aptitude and achievement examinations on our campus during candidates' Shadow Day.
- Fifth through Eighth Grade candidates sit for the Independent School Entrance Exam (ISEE). Details on the examination, which is administered on our campus and at other area locations, and upcoming test dates are found in the Admissions Calendar, ISEE registration booklet and online:

#### Admissions Decisions and Notification

Once all required criteria are met and the application process is completed, your student's application is presented to the Admissions Committee. The committee includes the St. Anne's School Admissions staff, Program Directors, the Head of School, assessment faculty and classroom teachers.

- Families applying prior to February 14 will receive notification of the admissions decision on or before April 1.
- Families applying after February 14 will receive notification on a rolling basis.

Decisions regarding admission and class placement are made at the sole discretion of the Head of School and the Admissions Committee. These decisions are final.



# **Applicant Waiting Pool**

If a student is accepted by the Admissions Committee for a grade level that has no immediate openings, the student's application is placed in the Waiting Pool. Should a space become available, all applicants in the Waiting Pool for the available grade are reviewed; no preference is given to the sequential order in which the application is received. By October 1 each year, the Waiting Pool will be cleared. Those remaining in the Waiting Pool are invited to reapply for the following academic year, with no additional application or screening fees.

## Important Application Dates

September 1: The Admissions Office begins accepting applications for the following academic year.

**February 15:** The deadline for applications for the following academic year to receive first-round consideration.

**After February 15:** Applications for the following academic year accepted at the discretion of the Admissions Committee. Admissions decisions are made on a rolling basis.

April 1: The Admissions Office notifies families applying prior to February 15 of the admissions decisions.

 Families submitting applications after February 15 will be notified of the admissions decisions on a rolling basis.

#### Birth Date Requirements

Prospective students must meet the following age requirements by **September 1** of the year in which they will enter the class:

Preschool:3 years oldPrekindergarten:4 years oldKindergarten:5 years old
