



Birth Date Requirements

Prospective students must meet the following age requirements by **September 1** of the year in which they will enter the class:

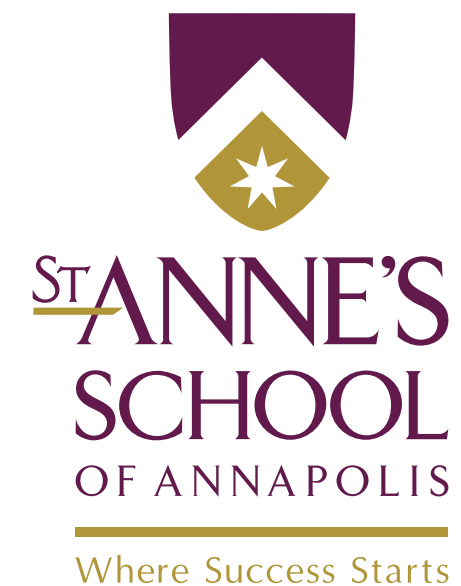
- Preschool:** 3 years old
- Prekindergarten:** 4 years old
- Kindergarten:** 5 years old

Admission Fees

- An application fee of \$50, payable at the time of application submission
- Screening/testing fee of \$75 for Early Childhood and Lower School applicants

St. Anne's School of Annapolis and You: Making a Good Match

We value your interest in St. Anne's School of Annapolis, its mission and program. Our admissions process is designed to be welcoming, fair, open, inclusive and informative. We invite you to contact our Admissions Office should you require additional information, clarification or assistance. We welcome you and your family to our school and look forward to supporting you through the admissions process.

Designed to allow the school and your family to become better acquainted, the admissions process will help determine whether St. Anne's School is the best learning environment for your child. We are committed to providing as much information as possible about our school and encourage your questions. Our Admissions Committee's top priority is making a good match for each student entering our program as we believe that is the key to each child's ability to thrive, be happy and achieve success at St. Anne's School.

Visiting the St. Anne's School Campus

For your convenience we offer three ways to visit our campus.

- **Walk In Wednesdays:** Tours offered every Wednesday during the school year at 9:00 a.m.
- **Open Houses:** We host four formal open house events annually, on both weekdays and weekends, for families' convenience. Please refer to the enclosed Admissions Calendar or our website at St.AnnesSchool.org for specific days and times.
- **Private Tours:** Call our Admissions Office at 410.263.8650 for a private campus visit and to request an admissions packet.

Touring our campus is an essential part of the St. Anne's School admissions process. Your tour will introduce you to our faculty, staff and students and will give you the chance to witness our educational methods in action. We will discuss our program in detail and answer any questions you may have. Tours last approximately 90 minutes. We invite you to contact the Admissions Office to schedule your visit.

The Admissions Process: A Step-by-Step Guide

1. Contact the Admissions Office to schedule a private tour.

2. Complete and submit the following forms:

- St. Anne's School Application for Admission

A complete application includes transcripts and teacher recommendations from your child's current school. The transcript release and teacher recommendation forms included in the Admissions Packet should be submitted to your child's school after January 15. Applicants to Middle School (Fifth through Eighth Grades) are required to submit recommendations from both math and language arts teachers.

- Remit the \$50 application fee with your application.
- If applying for financial aid, applications should be submitted at the same time you apply for admission. Please refer to *Financial Aid* brochure for further information.



3. Set up screening and testing.

The Admissions Office will contact you once they receive your application to schedule dates for your child's screening and testing. You will find the current testing dates listed in the Admissions Calendar.

- Preschool, Prekindergarten and Kindergarten candidates are given a standardized readiness screening in a small group setting on the St. Anne's School campus.
- First through Fourth Grade candidates are administered academic aptitude and achievement examinations on the St. Anne's School campus.
- Remit the \$75 fee for Preschool through Fourth Grade screening
- Fifth through Eighth Grade candidates sit for the Independent School Entrance Exam (ISEE). Details on the examination, which is administered on campus and at other area locations, and upcoming test dates are found in the enclosed ISEE registration booklet and online: <http://www.erbtest.org/parents/admissions/isee>. (Fees for the Middle School testing are paid directly to ISEE.)

4. Schedule a Student Shadow Day for First through Eighth Grade candidates.

Give your child the chance to experience the classroom setting and get to know our students and teachers. This program is an excellent way for your child to explore life at St. Anne's School. Shadow Days are scheduled through the Admissions Office.

Admissions Decisions and Notification

Once all required criteria are met and the application process is completed, a student's application is presented to the Admissions Committee. The committee includes the St. Anne's School Admissions staff, division heads, the head of school, assessment faculty and classroom teachers.

Families applying prior to February 15 will receive notification of the admissions decision on or before April 1. Families applying after February 15 will receive notification on a rolling basis.

Decisions regarding admission and class placement are made at the sole discretion of the head of school and the Admissions Committee. These decisions are final.

Applicant Waiting Pool

If a student is accepted by the Admissions Committee for a grade level that has no immediate openings, the student's application is placed in the Waiting Pool. Should a space become available, all applicants in the Waiting Pool for the available grade are reviewed; no preference is given to the sequential order in which the application is received. By October 1 each year, the Waiting Pool will be cleared. Those remaining in the Waiting Pool are invited to reapply for the following academic year, with no additional application or screening fees.

Important Application Dates

September 1: The Admissions Office begins accepting applications for the following academic year.

February 15: The deadline for applications for the following academic year to receive first-round consideration.

After February 15: Applications for the following academic year accepted at the discretion of the Admissions Committee. Admissions decisions are made on a rolling basis.

April 1: The Admissions Office notifies families applying prior to February 15 of the admissions decisions.
